Results of Meeting

1. Opening Remarks

John Lohmeyer, the T10 Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., Thursday March 13, 2003. He thanked Bob Kando and Paul Aloisi of Texas Instruments for hosting the meeting.

John said that INCITS subgroup membership forms and the T10 document subscription forms are available on the meeting disk. He said that people should use these forms to ensure the INCITS Secretariat has the latest membership information. These forms should be mailed directly to the INCITS Secretariat.

As is customary, the people attending introduced themselves and a copy of the attendance list was circulated. Copies of the draft agenda and general information on T10 were made available to those attending.

2. Approval of Agenda

No additions/changes were made to the draft agenda.

John Lohmeyer moved and Ralph Weber seconded that the agenda be approved. In the absence of any objections, the motion passed unanimously.

The following items were added/revised during the course of the meeting:

3. Attendance and Membership

The membership requirements were reviewed. INCITS rules permit one vote per organization. An individual from a new organization must attend two out of three consecutive plenary meetings. He/she may apply for voting membership the second meeting via a letter to the Chair of T10. The individual may begin voting at the beginning of his/her second meeting.

To maintain membership, organizations must pay the INCITS Service Fee (\$800).

John briefly discussed the mailing fees. Complete pricing information is contained in the 2003 membership form (available at ftp://ftp.t10.org/t10/mem_form.txt).

There are also minimum attendance requirements to maintain voting membership on T10. If a member organization fails to attend two of the last three T10 meetings, they are warned that failing to attend the next T10 meeting would result in their membership being terminated.

The Chair said he had sent letters to 15 people from 7 organizations informing them that their membership was in jeopardy due to non-attendance (see 03-065r0) and that their membership would be terminated if they did not attend this meeting. The following organizations were in attendance jeopardy:

Congruent Software, Inc. Dell Computer Corp. Hitachi Cable Manchester Molex Inc. Pivot3, Inc. Madison Cable Corp. UNISYS Corporation

All of organizations in attendance jeopardy were present. So no organizations were changed to non-voting status.

The following organizations joined the committee at this meeting:

Iomega Hitachi Global Storage Technologies

The T10 membership during the meeting was 42 organizations up from the 40 member organizations prior to the meeting. Enclosure (1) is the list of the people present at the meeting and enclosure (2) is the current T10 membership list.

John Lohmeyer reminded members that failure to vote on two out of the last three letter ballots also would result in membership jeopardy and then reported on the status of companies that have not voted on recent letter ballots. Amphenol, Emulex, and Philips will be in letter ballot jeopardy if they fail to return the next letter ballot.

4. Approval of Minutes - January 2003 Meeting - Portland, OR (T10/03-048r0)

John Lohmeyer moved and Ralph Weber seconded that the minutes be approved. In the absence of any objections, the motion passed unanimously.

5. Document Distribution

Members who have any problems with their mailing subscription should deal directly with Parthenia Purnell (ppurnell@itic.org) (202) 626-5741. A subscription form is included on the meeting disk.

John Lohmeyer requested that all documents for the next mailing be in his hands in electronic format by 10:30 a.m. on Thursday March 20, 2003. Documents received after this time may go into a subsequent mailing.

John reminded the committee of the requirements for document submission. Since T10 meets its document retention requirements by preparing mailings, documents included in the mailing must be suitable for archiving. This means that native-format and/or Portable Document Format (PDF) electronic originals with proper identification must be submitted.

People can obtain T10 document numbers and revised T10 document numbers by filling out a web form at http://www.t10.org/members/. The assigned T10 document number will be sent to the requestor by e-mail. The requestor may then reply to this email, including the document to be posted as an attachment. The document will be automatically posted on the T10 web site.

T10 members can complete this entire process using their personal T10 password. John explained that members who do not know their password should surf to the above URL and click on the "forgot password" link to have their password sent to them via e-mail.

John noted that non-members can also use the above document number process, but their requests will require approval by an administrator.

8. Project Status Reports

8.1 Project Status Summary and INCITS Liaison [Lohmeyer]

John Lohmeyer said that the current T10 project status summary was included on the meeting disk and will be included in the mailing as usual.

John Lohmeyer reported that Bob Davis has been appointed the INCITS liaison to T10. Bob and John discussed INCITS issues of concern to T10.

John Lohmeyer reported that INCITS has issued a call for volunteers for T10 chair, which he had forwarded to the T10 reflector.

8.2 SCSI Fibre Channel Protocol - 2 (FCP-2) {Project 1144-D} [Peterson]

John Lohmeyer reported that FCP-2 will be going to BSR this week or next.

8.3 SCSI Architecture Model - 2 (SAM-2) {Project 1157-D} [Weber]

John Lohmeyer reported that SAM-2 will be going to BSR this week or next.

Ralph Weber reported that the first revision of SAM-2 for ISO consideration has been prepared and is available as ftp://ftp.t10.org/t10/drafts/sam2/sam2i25.pdf.

Ralph Weber took an action item to notify Gary Robinson that the SAM-2 ISO revision can be found at ftp://ftp.t10.org/t10/drafts/sam2/sam2i25.pdf.

8.4 Object-based Storage Devices Commands (OSD) {Project 1355-D} [Weber]

Ralph Weber reported that SNIA OSD group expects to have a new OSD revision posted by April 15th.

8.5 SCSI Medium Changer Commands - 2 (SMC-2) {Project 1383-D} [Oetting]

Erich Oetting reported that SMC-2 rev 05b was posted last Friday. Erich reported on the activities of the SMC-2 working group. Erich stated that resolution of the letter ballot comments should be complete in May.

8.6 SCSI Primary Commands - 3 (SPC-3) {Project 1416-D} [Weber]

Ralph Weber reported that revision 12 of SPC-3 will be available in time for the mailing and will contain all the proposals approved by this meeting.

Ralph Weber reminded the committee that the target letter ballot date for SPC-3 is November 2003. He noted that, based on this letter ballot date, editing review meetings will begin this month to ready SPC-3 for letter ballot.

8.7 SCSI Block Commands - 2 (SBC-2) {Project 1417-D} [Elliott]

Rob Elliott reported that SBC-2 rev 09 should be available before the next meeting, incorporating proposals accepted at the last meeting.

8.8 SCSI Stream Commands - 2 (SSC-2) {Project 1434-D} [Peterson]

In the absence of Dave Peterson, John Lohmeyer reported that Dave intends to carry SSC-2 to conclusion of letter ballot comment resolution.

8.9 SCSI Passive Interconnect Performance (PIP) {Project 1439-D} [Daggett]

John Lohmeyer reported that PIP is at public review closing on March 17 and that no comments have been received to date.

8.10 SCSI Serial Bus Protocol -3 (SBP-3) {Project 1467-D} [Johansson]

Peter Johansson reported that the SBP-3 working group met January 20 - 21 in Wailea, HI and this week, March 11, during the T10 meetings in Dallas, TX.

At the Dallas meeting, the working group requested the editor to prepare SBP-3 Revision 3.0 for submission to the T10 chair for letter ballot.

Peter noted that a letter ballot comments resolution meeting may be held during the May meeting week.

8.11 SCSI Signal Modeling - 2 (SSM-2) {Project 1514-D} [Aloisi/Manildi]

John Lohmeyer reported that SSM-2 is at public review closing on March 17 and that no comments have been received to date.

8.12 SCSI RDMA Protocol - 2 (SRP-2) {Project 1524-D} [Simpson]

Cris Simpson reported on the SRP-2 issues that were discussed in the CAP working group (minutes in 03-123). He noted that proposals for changes to be included in SRP-2 are anticipated at the next meeting.

8.13 SCSI Parallel Interface - 5 (SPI-5) {Project 1525-D} [Penokie]

John Lohmeyer reported that SPI-5 is at public review closing on March 17 and that no comments have been received to date.

George Penokie reported that the ISO version of SPI-5 is ready for delivery to the IR as soon as the FCD number is available.

8.14 SCSI Management Server Commands (MSC) {Project 1528-D} [Penokie/Elliott]

George Penokie reported that an overview presentation on MSC may be brought to the CAP meeting in May.

8.15 MultiMedia Command Set - 4 (MMC-4) {Project 1545-D} [McFerrin]

Bill McFerrin reported on the activities of the MMC-4 working group. He stated that the information for the body of the document have been collected. Work on the annexes is continuing.

Bill stated that the MMC will be unable to meet with T10 during the May meeting week. Instead, a meeting is being planned for mid-April.

The group has established a rough deadline of May for new proposals.

8.16 Automation/Drive Interface - Transport Protocol (ADT) {Project 1557-D} [Entzel]

Paul Entzel reported on the activities of the ADI working group (minutes in 03-117). He stated that both ADT and ADC will go to letter ballot after the May meeting or after the July meeting at the latest.

John Lohmeyer reported that the INCITS letter ballot on closing the ADP project closes on April 14.

8.17 Automation/Drive Interface - Commands (ADC) {Project 1558-D} [Entzel/Wideman]

This topic was covered in item 8.16.

8.18 SCSI Enclosure Services - 2 (SES-2) {Project 1559-D} [Elliott]

Rob Elliott reported that SES-2 will not publish a new revision until after the May meeting because a proposal has yet to be approved by CAP.

8.19 Fibre Channel Protocol - 3 (FCP-3) {Project 1560-D} [Peterson]

John Lohmeyer reported that the committee may need to look for a new FCP-3 editor.

8.20 SCSI Architecture Model - 3 (SAM-3) {Project 1561-D} [Weber]

Ralph Weber reported that revision 06 will be available in time for the mailing and will contain all the changes approved by this meeting.

8.21 Serial Attached SCSI (SAS) {Project 1562-D} [Elliott]

Rob Elliott reported on the activities of the SAS working group (minutes in 03-122). Revision 03f will available in time for the mailing but will not include the planned changes to the port layer.

8.22 Serial Attached SCSI - 2 (SAS-2) {Project 1601-D} [Elliott]

Rob Elliott reported that no work will be done on SAS-2 until the SAS letter ballot is resolved.

John Lohmeyer reported that submission of proposals for SAS-2 is being encouraged for the May meeting.

8.23 SCSI Stream Commands - 3 (SSC-3) {Project 1611-D} [Peterson]

John Lohmeyer reported that the committee may need to look for a new SSC-3 editor. Paul Entzel stated that efforts are underway to find a new editor.

9. Old Business

9.1 ANSI INCITS 330-2000 Defect Report (03-021) (RBC-A) [Atkinson, Roberts]

John Lohmeyer said that an email (T10/03-021r0) was received from Ben Atkinson pointing out some defects in the RBC standard. He noted that the CAP working group (minutes in 03-123) reviewed the draft amendment correcting the defects (03-021).

The committee discussed the process of revising the document.

John stated his intention to issue a letter ballot on forwarding the revised amendment.

9.2 Make Element Reservations Obsolete in SMC-2 [Oetting]

Erich Oetting requested that this item be dropped from future agendas.

10. New Business

10.1 2003 Five-Year Maintenance Review of T10 Standards (03-071) [Spittle]

John Lohmeyer reviewed the T10 standards on which INCITS has requested a five-year maintenance review (03-071r0).

Ralph Weber moved that T10 recommend to INCITS that SBC, SMC, SPI-2, SBC-2, SES, the SES amendment, and SSC-2 be reaffirmed. Peter Johansson seconded the motion. The motion passed on a vote of 33:0:0:9=42.

John Lohmeyer took an action item to notify INCITS that T10 recommends the reaffirmation of SBC, SMC, SPI-2, SBC-2, SES, the SES amendment, and SSC-2.

10.2 Actions on Parallel SCSI Working Group Recommendations

Because the Parallel SCSI working group did not meet this week, no recommendations required consideration at this meeting.

10.3 Actions on SAS Working Group Recommendations

10.3.1 SAS PHY recommendations

Because of the SAS letter ballot, all SAS PHY working group recommendations are being resolved as letter ballot comments.

10.3.2 SAS Protocol recommendations

Because of the SAS letter ballot, all SAS Protocol working group recommendations are being resolved as letter ballot comments.

10.4 Actions on CAP Working Group Recommendations

George Penokie described the following proposal recommended for inclusion in SAM-3 SPC-3 SAS FCP-3 SRP-2: Device names and VPD data (02-419r3)

Rob Elliott moved that 02-419r3 be approved for inclusion in SAM-3 SPC-3 SAS FCP-3 SRP-2. Ron Roberts seconded the motion.

Ed Gardner spoke against the motion stating that the proposal is inconsistent and should be referred back to the working group for further review and revision. Ed claimed that as written the proposal has the effect of prohibiting target devices supporting multiple protocols.

Rob Elliott stated that Ed's characterization of the proposal is incorrect and Ed debated that point.

Peter Johansson spoke against the motion based on a concern that the proposal requires transport protocols to define identifier names formats.

The motion failed on a vote of 9:10:14:9=42.

George Penokie and Ralph Weber described the following documents recommended for inclusion in SAM-3 and SPC-3:

Remove TARGET RESET from SAM-3 and SPC-3 (03-001r1) [Weber] {17:2:2} What is architectural about SAM-3 CDB definitions? (03-005r1) {r0 as revised} [Weber] {unanimous}

Ralph Weber moved that 03-001r1 and 03-005r1 be approved for inclusion in SAM-3 and SPC-3. Erich Oetting seconded the motion.

Peter Johansson moved to divide the question. Bill Galloway seconded the motion to divide the question. In the absence of any objections, the motion to divide the question passed unanimously.

Peter Johansson spoke against 03-001r1 stating that removing the target reset will work a hardship on protocol standards writers. David Black noted that SAM-3 will still contain forms of target reset that can be referenced.

The motion to approve inclusion of 03-001r1 passed on a vote of 24:2:6:10=42:

The motion to approve inclusion of 03-005r1 passed on a vote of 27:0:3:12=42.

George Penokie and Ralph Weber described the following document recommended for inclusion in SAM-3: SAM-3 Glossary Cleanup (03-004r2)

Ralph Weber moved that 03-004r2 be approved for inclusion in SAM-3. Bill Galloway seconded the motion. The motion passed on a vote of 29:0:2:11=42.

George Penokie and Ralph Weber described the following documents recommended for inclusion in SPC-3: SPC-3 Rename some SAS additional sense codes (03-088r0) [Elliott] {unanimous} Other SPC-3 Fixes (03-092r1) [Penokie] {unanimous}

Rob Elliott moved that 03-088r0 and 03-092r1 be approved for inclusion in SPC-3. Bill Galloway seconded the motion. The motion passed on a vote of 26:0:5:11=42.

10.5 Actions on Other Working Group Recommendations

No recommendations from other working groups were brought to this meeting.

10.6 More Descriptive Name for T10 [Lohmeyer]

John Lohmeyer reported that changes in the INCITS web site have resulted in a request to update the name of the T10 committee.

The committee discussed how T13 and T11 have responded to similar requests to update their committee name.

George Penokie moved that the T10 committee name be changed to 'SCSI storage interfaces'. Bill Galloway seconded the motion.

Ron Roberts moved to call the question. Mark Evans seconded the motion to call the question. The motion to call the question passed 24:2:3:13=42.

The main motion passed on a vote of 32:0:3:7=42.

John Lohmeyer took an action item to notify INCITS that T10 has voted to change its name to 'SCSI storage interfaces'.

Gary Robinson presented the ISO/IEC report and provided an electronic report in 03-118.

11.2 ISO/IEC Business [Robinson]

Gary Robinson moved and Erich Oetting seconded to approve the NWIP (T10/03-083r0) as a US contribution to JTC1/SC25 and to approve the NP to be issued by SC25, answering the 6 questions 'Yes' and naming Gary S. Robinson as project editor. The roll call motion passed 33:0:0:9=42, with the details the same as shown in 11.2.1.

Gary Robinson took an action item to submit 03-083r0 as a NWIP for SSM-2.

11.2.3 NWIP for SCSI PIP (03-084) [Robinson]

12.1 T11 Liaison Report (03-125) [Snively]

Steve Wilson presented the T11 liaison report contained in T10/03-125r0.

12.2 T13 Liaison Report [Colegrove]

Dan Colegrove reported to the committee on T13 activities and Pete McLean, T13 Chair, provided the following electronic report:

T13 Liaison Report - February 24, 2003

T13 met last in Irvine, CA on February 18 through 20 with 22 people present. Membership is currently 20 voting organizations.

ATA/ATAPI Host Adapter Standard, T13/1510D, has been forwarded to INCITS for first public review. Public review closes March 17.

T13 voted to recommend that INCITS withdraw ANSI INCITS 316-1998, 1394 to ATA Attachment - Tailgate. The recommendation has been forwarded to INCITS.

T13 voted to recommend that INCITS reaffirm ANSI INCITS 317-1998, ATA Attachment with Packet Interface - 4. The recommendation has been forwarded to INCITS.

The ATA/ATAPI-7, T13/1532D, is in development. The Serial ATA promoters filed copyright releases on the Serial ATA 1.0a specification. T13 has created a draft of ATA/ATAPI-7 volume 3 with this material included and begun to review the draft.

ITIC requested that T13 recommend the name for the committee to be shown on the INCITS website. T13 is requesting that name be "ATA Storage Interfaces".

The chair of T13 Pete McLean has notified the committee that he is being laid off by Maxtor Corporation and will no longer serve as chair after 4 April. T13 vice-chair Dan Colegrove has agreed to chair T13 until INCITS appoints a new Chairman.

12.3 SFF Industry Group [Allan]

Vit Novak reported that work on SFF 8425 continues and that another SSWG will be held during the May T10 meeting week. An electronic report was received from Dal Allan following the meeting:

A mockup of an SFF-8221 'Pre-Aligned 2.5" Drive >10mm Form Factor' was passed around to attendees and some descriptive text about the system characteristics and handle will be included in the next revision. It is anticipated that Rev 2.8 of SFF-8470 'Multilane Connector' will be the final specification, and be submitted to IEC for standardization. The discussion about the scope for SFF-8082 'Guidelines for Labeling Cables and Ports' establised the immediate goals of the project. Technical comments on SFF-8482 'Internal Serial Attachment Connector' for SAS will result in a new revision of the specification. There is optimism that the SFF-

8425 for 'Single Voltage Drives' SSWG will be able to broaden the specifications of regulated power, and define ripple more precisely. Both of these will assist JBOD and RAID subsystem design.

12.4 IEEE 1394 [Johansson]

Peter Johansson reported IEEE 1394 activities and provided the following electronic report for the minutes.

The Ballot Response Committee (BRC) for IEEE P1394.1, High Performance Serial Bus Bridges, has resolved, in principal, all of the comments received during Sponsor Ballot. The Editor is incorporating the agreed changes in anticipation of a recirculation ballot this year, with projected approval as an IEEE standard in 2003. The BRC for IEEE P1394.3, Peer to Peer Data Transport, a protocol built upon SBP-2, has resolved all Sponsor ballot comments. The Vice Chair, Alan Berkema (Alan_Berkema@HP.com), is expected to initiate a recirculation ballot shortly.

The 1394 Trade Association Wireless working group is developing a "protocol adaptation layer" (PAL) to enable IEEE 1394 applications to interoperate with like applications in IEEE P802.11e devices. In the absence of Roger Cummings, David Black reported that SNIA is working the final details of SMI version 1. The SMI 1.1 work will begin in the next few weeks.
