1. Opening Remarks

3. Approval of Agenda

The agenda developed at the meeting was approved.

4. Report on changes made on the document from Revision 5 to Revision 6.

Bill Dallas reported on the editorial and technical changes made in the CAM document which changed the revision from 5 to 6. These changes were the following:

- Changes made by the January 1994 CAM Working Group.
- Comments on Clause 11 made by Ralph Weber of Digital Equipment Corporation and Gary Porter of Ancot Corporation. Disposition of these comments are included at the end of these minutes.

5. Review of the Revision 6 of the CAM document.

The CAM Working Group started reviewing the CAM document from where it left off at the January CAM Working Group. A number of editorial changes were made to the document for clarification and correctness.

Gary Stephens of FSI objected to CAM not addressing SCSI-2 SOFT RESETS. Discussion of the CAM model pointed out that there is no central repository of Inquiry response data knowledge to determine if all Logical Units on the SCSI bus supports the SOFT RESET. Gary Stephens will be writing up a CAM soft reset functional specification for review by the CAM Working Group. I have since received this and will put it out on the SCSI reflector when I convert it from Word Perfect format to text.

A technical change was made to CAM, this involved XPT scan bus functionality. Currently CAM only allows the XTP to scan a SCSI bus to update it's internal ed[] tables. It was decided that this was too restrictive and a scan of a single Logical Unit was needed besides a SCSI bus scan. The editor was directed to include this functionality into CAM.

6. Action Items

Bill Dallas to post Gary Stephens CAM soft reset functional specification. Bill Dallas to make all working group changes to the CAM document. Document revision will change from 6 to 7.

7. Meeting Schedule

The next meeting of the CAM Working Group is planned for May 16, 1994 at the Sheraton Inn Harrisburg in Harrisburg, Pa. The meeting is expected to run from 9:00am-5:00pm.
