The comment should be discussed at the next TC meeting, and if not definitively responded to at once, an interim acknowledgment should be sent along with an estimated date of action.

The final response to the commenter must include the provision that the commenter has twenty working days from the postmark of the technical committees response to indicate, in a written statement, acceptance or rejection of the TC response.
