I am perplexed by the outcome of the Plenary Committee vote taken at the Austin, TX meeting regarding my company membership extension.

I guess I see the Committee having dual standards. It is ok by the Committee members to let a man who's wife is pregnant miss several meetings and extend his company's membership but it <u>is not</u> ok for a female committee member who is pregnant to miss some meetings and have their company membership extended. The vote definitely demonstrates some kind of discrimination towards female members on the committee.

Unfortunately, Optimem is not as large as AT & T and there is no one else at my company, currently, that can attend these meetings for Optimem but myself.

I believe that the Committee members need to seriously look at the double standards they are presenting and clearly identify guidelines so that this type of discrimination does not happen again.
